Yucaipa Low-Cost Rabies Vaccinations and Dog Licensing Clinics Scheduled

The San Bernardino County Animal Care & Control Program has scheduled the following low-cost rabies vaccination and dog licensing clinics in Yucaipa. For the safety of you and your pets, and other visitors, please make sure your dog is on a leash at all times during the scheduled clinics. Also, no dogs in heat and no aggressive dogs please! Cats may also be vaccinated, but must be brought in a carrier to avoid problems.

Table with 4 columns: DATE, DAY, SITE/ADDRESS, TIME. Rows include June 30 Monday at 7th Street Park and July 31 Thursday at Yucaipa Community Park.

- Rabies vaccinations will be provided for \$6.00 and must be paid in cash.
• Dog licenses for altered dogs will cost \$15.00 for each (\$9.00 for senior citizens).
• Dog licenses for unaltered dogs will cost \$96.00.
• Licenses may be paid with either cash or check.

If you are interested in having your pet spayed or neutered, and want to receive the reduced license fee, please ask our staff at the clinics about our spaying & neutering voucher program. Pet owners may also call the Yucaipa Animal Placement Society (YAPS) at 909-790-1440 or 1-877-POPCO for further information about low cost spaying and neutering programs.

Very Important – Please Note

Vaccinations will ONLY be given if:

- Dogs are on leashes strong enough to safely control them.
• Pet Owners can safely control their animals, including holding their pet for the vaccination(s).
• Adults hold their animals at all times.
• Cats are in a carrier - Only one cat per carrier.
