

RESOLUTION NO. 2005-05

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YUCAIPA,
CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING A VECTOR CONTROL COUNCIL
COMMITTEE**

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Yucaipa (the “City Council”) has previously established an ad-hoc Vector Control Committee to review, evaluate, and oversee vector control services in the City of Yucaipa; and

WHEREAS, the ad-hoc Vector Control Committee was uniquely qualified to review and evaluate a variety of land use and waste management issues involving commercial and recreational animal raising activities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the ad-hoc Vector Control Committee should become a standing City Council Committee with an enhanced scope to address other issues in addition to poultry ranches. The enhanced scope will include rural, commercial and recreational animal raising and agricultural activities. The Committee will consist of two appointed members of the City Council, with two (2) representatives of the poultry industry, two (2) staff representatives (one (1) County, and one (1) City), one (1) Cooperative Extension Farm Advisor, and three (3) members of the general public to serve in an advisory capacity.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. MEMBERSHIP. Two (2) members of the City Council shall be selected to serve as the Vector Control Committee.

SECTION 2. ADVISORY MEMBERSHIP. Two (2) representatives of the poultry industry, two (2) staff members, one (1) Cooperative Extension Farm Advisor, and three (3) members of the general public.

SECTION 3. TERM. All members and advisory members shall serve at the pleasure of the City Council.

SECTION 4. MEETINGS. The Vector Control Committee shall hold meetings on the fourth Monday of every other month beginning in January of each year.

SECTION 5. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES. It shall be the duty of the Vector Control Committee to review and make recommendations to the City Council regarding the following types of vector control matters and issues:


- A. Review and evaluate any issues or concerns regarding rural, commercial and recreational animal raising and agricultural activities.
- B. Review the annual manure management plans submitted for each ranch.


- C. Review and evaluate proposed changes to ranch management strategies.
- D. Review and evaluate new vector control technologies that may become available to reduce adverse impacts associated with ranch operations.
