CONVENE CITY COUNCIL

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Captain Williams.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION

Approval and presentation of a Proclamation to Yucaipa Woman's Club

Virginia Cosby, Yucaipa Woman's Club (YWC) Treasurer, thanked the City Council for granting funds to assist the YWC and introduced the YWC members that were in attendance. Ms. Cosby stated that the Club House was built in 1922 on donated land with donated materials (with mostly volunteer labor) and that the members of the YWC took out a mortgage to cover the costs of items that were not paid for. Ms. Cosby stated that the Club House has supported the community for 117 years and that the YWC was founded in 1911.

On behalf of the City Council, Mayor Pro Tem Beaver presented the Yucaipa Woman's Club with a Proclamation congratulating the Yucaipa Woman's Club on the 100th anniversary of their home and expressing the City Council's most sincere gratitude for their distinguished and dedicated service to the City of Yucaipa and surrounding communities.

Ms. Cosby extended an invitation to all to attend the YWC Gala, scheduled for February 22, 2022, and announced that the Gala Ticketmaster was in the audience.

Councilmember Duncan, Mayor Pro Tem Beaver, Councilmember Bogh, Councilmember Thorp, and Mayor Avila each expressed their gratitude for the YWC's contributions to the community and commended the work of the YWC.

8. **SUBJECT:** YOUTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

RECOMMENDATION: That City Council appoint Gesenia Ramirez and Rhett Bogh to the Youth Advisory Committee.

DISCUSSION: Community Services Supervisor Martinez presented the Agenda Report and introduced Gesenia Ramirez and Rhett Bogh.

Gesenia Ramirez introduced herself to the City Council and stated the reasons why she believes that she would be a great addition to the Youth Advisory Committee (YAC). Ms.

Ramirez stated that she hopes to gain a learning experience by being a part of something that has the purpose of benefitting others and noted that she is a dedicated student and will also be a dedicated YAC Member.

Rhett Bogh introduced himself to the City Council and stated that he is part of the graduating class of 2024. Mr. Bogh shared that he races mountain bikes for the High School and that he enjoyed watching the development of the City's Wildwood Mountain Bike Trail. Mr. Bogh stated that one of his reasons for wanting to serve on the YAC is because it makes you more aware of the events and activities that are happening in the City and that it would be a good learning experience.

Ralph Grajeda, representing Yucaipa High School (YHS), provided information about the USA Baseball's National High School Invitational (NHSI), and requested financial support in the amount of \$10,000 to send the YHS Baseball Team to the NHSI.

2. Authorize an additional amount of \$5,000 for project administration and staff time for a total revised engineering design budget in the amount of \$103,800; and
3. Authorize the City Manager or his designee to administer the terms of the amended Agreement; and
4. Find that the public interest will not be best served by a formal proposal process, waive the formal solicitation of proposals/qualifications for Professional Environmental Services; and
5. Approve and authorize the City Manager to execute an Agreement for Professional Environmental Services with Michael Baker International in the not-to-exceed

amount of \$16,365 for regulatory permit processing for the Pendleton Avenue at Oak Glen Road Low Water Crossing Project.


