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### OBSERVATIONS:

Fania flies were observed in all coops (moderate) and larger flies were noted in all the other coops and fly traps on the east side of the coops. Many sites (under coops and large pile) were inspected for evidence of larvae.

In the one coop with the dirt floor (all others are concrete), compacted manure was inspected and only where the manure was wet was there a concentration of active larvae. All coops were sprayed with insecticide yesterday, July 30, 2018, so any larvae should have been eradicated. Fly traps were rejuvenated today, July 31, 2018, and were functioning properly. It was also noted that where the manure is staged for pickup that quite a large amount had been spread out. In checking several dry and wet areas in the immediate area, larvae (minimal) were discovered in the wet manure only.

There were several leaks noted. All broken eggs need to be abated between coops and in free range area. There were several dead chickens in the coops that were removed during inspection (probably due to the heat) for disposal. Two dead crows were also seen in the farthest east coop.

### RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Maintain removal of chicken manure per the Manure Management Plan requirements (logs sent to City every Monday).
- Disturb compacted manure/dirt mix under dirt coop where larvae were discovered and spray liberally with insecticide **TODAY**.
- Spray the spread out manure **TODAY** with insecticide and collect in a pile for regularly scheduled pickup tomorrow, Wednesday, August 1, 2018.
- Clean up broken eggs between coops and in the free range chicken enclosure.
- Remove all dead chicken and crows **TODAY**.

### ACTION TAKEN:

Next on-site inspection scheduled for **Tuesday, August 7, 2018**. Fines will be applied if all violations not taken care of before next inspection.
